Opportunity for Generosity Beginning February 18: Alms for The Presbyterian Community Center



This Lenten season you are invited to participate in the ancient spiritual practice of collecting alms. Throughout Christianity, faithful followers have given to the poor. As a Church family, we will collectively practice this by giving to the food pantry at the Presbyterian Community Center. Each week, there are different items to shop for and then bring to Church on Sunday to support the PCC. We bring these items each week rather than all at once to get ourselves in the spiritual rhythm of giving regularly so that beyond Lent this can be our regular practice. As a family, you can put out a cardboard box in your house labeling it "The Giving Box" and perhaps decorating it together so each week after shopping you have a spot where the

items are collected and can be remembered to come back to church. This can make the practice accessible for disciples of all ages.

Here's what we will collect each week for the PCC:

- Week 1 (2/18) Tomato Soup and Crackers (Souper Bowl Sunday brings in much more than Chicken Noodle Soup!)
- Week 2 (2/25) Pancake Mixes and Boxes of Cereal
- Week 3 (3/3) Canned Chicken, Tuna, Salmon Week 4 (3/10) Dessert Mixes and Pudding/Jello, Easter Candy
- Week 5 (3/17) Assorted Canned Fruit & Spaghetti Sauces
- Week 6 (3/24) Kroger Gift Card \$10, \$15 or \$20 to be given out during Holy Week with Food Orders to support families receiving an extra Easter Treat they get to pick out for themselves.

Justice, Equity, and Belonging Committee Black History Month

Black History month is upon us. Your Justice, Equity and Belonging Committee (formerlly the CARE Committee) of Raleigh Court Presbyterian Church is honored to respond to God's call for social justice and to advance racial equity within RCPC and beyond. For the next four weeks, our committee will publish short reflections in the This Week @ RCPC Monday emails. We pray these reflections will honor God and be faithful to his calling; "To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8). We start today with recognizing Black History month in the Raleigh Court Herald.

Historian Carter G. Woodson launched Black History Week in 1926, to recognize the significant contributions of African Americans, to coincide with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and abolitionist/writer Frederick Douglass. Fifty years later, Congress expanded Black History week to Black History Month. At that time, President Gerald Ford urged the country to "seize the opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of Black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history."1

Why should RCPC be recognizing Black History month? There are a number of reasons, many of which we may consider as being polite or politically correct. It is, however the Justice, Equity and Belonging Committee's belief that the primary reason to recognize Black History month is because of God's call on our lives. Micah 6:8 referenced above asks, What does the Lord require of you? And Micah replies that we are to "act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."

In a recent and current sermon series, "Thresholds" and now "One Anothering," Andrew has lead us to explore how we belong to God and how that belonging calls us to discover how we belong to one another, not just here at RCPC but to others in our broader community. Our committee is striving to live faithfully to this call by reaching out and engaging with our Black community. We believe however, that our efforts must be genuine and authentic, not a box checked to say we are faithful.


