

Conversations -THAT CHANGE US-



October Mission Partner: House of Bread



House of Bread is a ministry of support for under-resourced women looking to make a fresh start. Through relationships built by baking one bread loaf at a time, House of Bread shares tools for restoring confidence, dignity, and hope. Over the course of a six-week session, women learn job and personal skills through hands-on training, coupled with emotional and spiritual support, while baking and selling bread alongside volunteers from the Roanoke community. In addition to learning basic kitchen and baking skills, women receive ServSafe food handler and/or manager training, develop customer service experience, and partner one-on-one with mentors who work with them to set and meet goals. Throughout the year, House of Bread Operates three sessions for students with each session costing \$10,000 which covers supplies, stipends to students, and leadership of the program. 
