Most of us tend to think of the second half of life as largely about getting old, dealing with health issues, and letting go of life, but the whole thesis of this book is exactly the opposite. What looks like falling down can largely be experienced as "falling upward." In fact, it is not a loss but somehow actually a gain, as we have all seen with elders who have come to their fullness. The Seekers will study this book together as they contemplate how growth and transformation is for all of God's people, no matter where they are in life.

The Bible in Black & White





Sermon Series: From Generation to Generation

This year we mark Pentecost, the birth of the Church, by celebrating the 100th anniversary of our congregation, Raleigh Court Presbyterian Church. In 1924, Dr. G.M. Maxwell crafted a poem to mark the church's founding, calling it "The Church of the Open Door." During these Easter weeks, we will look at some of the stanzas of that poem and where, biblically, they originate. We will also be sharing stories and anecdotes from the 100 years of RCPC in sermons each Sunday in April and May to frame our life together in Jesus Christ as we begin to ask, "Who is God calling us to be in our next hundred years?"

We are looking forward to strengthening and growing our earth care focus in and outside the church community. You might have noticed some more recycling opportunities and we hope to begin composting our food waste at Fellowship dinners in the near future. Please be on the lookout for two exciting opportunities as the Earth Care Committee hosts a Blessing of the Animals service on April 21 and a tree planting event later in April.

Justice, Equity, & Belonging Mission Group Update

On Saturday, April 13, you are joyously invited by the Presbytery of the Peaks Racial Equity Subcommittee, to share in a wonderful learning experience as we gather in Farmville VA to visit former Robert Russa Moton High School, now a National Historic Landmark and museum, and the birthplace of America's student-led civil rights revolution. Dreamed of by 16-year-old Barbara Johns, in 1951, a strike by Moton students to protest the poor conditions of their segregated school led to the construction of the new Moton High School for Blacks in 1953. The "field trip" begins with a "Lunch-n-Learn" at Longwood University to include a boxed lunch (no cost to you) and presentations by Dr. W. Taylor Reveley, President, Longwood University, and Ken Woodley, author of "The Road to Healing." After this session there will be a private tour of the museum (again, at no cost to you). Opportunity for Generosity: Habitat for Humanity Volunteer Work Days



This spring RCPC will once again partner with Habitat for Humanity by sponsoring two volunteer work days. Habitat for Humanity provides affordable mortgages, financial education, and training for families who are unable to obtain a home through conventional means. To qualify for a nointerest 30-year loan from Habitat, candidates are required to complete

over a year of homeownership classes and sweat equity hours on other properties as well as their own. Mortgage payments are used to build future Habitat houses.

Although it is too early to know which specific site or sites we will be working on, the focus of construction will be in the City Target Area in SE Roanoke City. Our sponsored work days will be Wednesday, April 24 and Saturday, April 27. Sign-up to volunteer online at tinyurl.com/RCPCHabitatVolunteer2024 or at the link in the This Week @ RCPC.

All work days will be 8:00 AM - 2:00 PM and daily groups must be 12 volunteers or less. No experience is necessary but all volunteers must be at least 16 years old. Habitat will provide all required tools and safety equipment, water, coffee and snacks. Volunteers will need to provide their own lunch and a refillable water bottle, work gloves are strongly advised. Dress for the weather and wear sturdy closed-toed shoes like hiking boots.
